CSVT Update for Upcoming Week

Montoursville, **PA** – Work is progressing on the Northern Section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties as follows:

Winfield Interchange:

Route 15 northbound is reduced to a single lane so the contractor can reconstruct the center portion of the highway. Wide loads over 14 feet are prohibited. The single lane condition is expected to remain in place for most of the construction season. The southbound passing lane will be closed during the day for the northbound reconstruction work.

Motorists should be alert for construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway.

Drainage and earthwork operations will continue during daylight hours only.

Northumberland County:

Earthwork and drainage will continue. Route 147 traffic is using a temporary crossover to the new northbound bridge over Chillisquaque Creek. There will be work at the southbound bridge spanning Chillisquaque Creek. There will be intermittent flagging under the bridge at Hidden Paradise Road and Ridge Road.

Work will be performed on concrete walls at Ridge Road and Wooded Run.

Construction continues on the bridge spanning Ridge Road and Wooded Run.

Earthwork and drainage work will continue.

River Bridge:

Construction of Piers 1 through 8 and the bridge abutment will continue on the west side of the river. Piers 4 through 7 are complete. Concrete is scheduled to be placed for Pier 1, Pier 8 and the abutment, next week.

Another group of steel girders have been delivered and are expected to be placed on river bridge Span 6, weather permitting.

The causeway in the river has been extended north for work on Pier 9. Sheet piles are expected to be driven within the next two weeks.

Construction is ongoing on the abutment on the Northumberland side of the river. The contractor began driving sheet piles for Pier 13.
