CSVT Update for Upcoming Week

Montoursville, PA – Work is progressing on the Northern Section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties as follows:

Winfield Interchange:

Route 15 northbound remains reduced to a single lane so the contractor can complete reconstruction of the center portion of the highway. Weather permitting, traffic will be shifted to the center lane the week of June 4. County Line Road east of Route 15 will be closed when traffic is switched.

Work will continue on the County Line Road bridge, the bridge spanning Route 15 and the interchange ramp bridge.

Wide loads over 14 feet are prohibited in the northbound direction. The single lane condition is expected to remain in place for most of the construction season. The southbound passing lane will be closed during the day for the northbound reconstruction work.

Drainage and earthwork operations will continue during daylight hours only.

Northumberland County:

Work on the southbound bridge spanning Chillisquaque Creek, the bridges over Wooded Run and the bridges spanning Ridge Road is continuing. Route 147 traffic is using a temporary crossover to the new northbound bridge over Chillisquaque Creek.

Intermittent traffic stoppages are expected on Ridge Road on the north side of the bridge.

Work on Pier 1 is scheduled to begin, which will require traffic on Hidden Paradise Raod to be reduced to a single lane.

River Bridge:

Construction of Piers 3 through 8 are complete. Construction continues on Piers 1 and 2 and Abutment 1. Concrete is scheduled to be placed for the abutment wing wall and Pier 9 caissons next week.

Beam setting is complete for Span 5 and Span 6. Steel girders have been delivered for Span 7. Erection is expected to begin within the next several week

Footer excavation and sheet pile driving will continue for Pier 13.
