## **CSVT Update for Upcoming Week**

**Montoursville, PA** – Work is progressing on the Northern Section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties as follows:

## **River Bridge:**

The contractor, Trumbull Corporation, will continue work on the CSVT river bridge.

The contractor will set beams in Span 3 next week. Beams are set in Spans 4 through 8.

Piers 9 through 14 are under construction on the east side of the river.

## Winfield Interchange:

The contractor, New Enterprise Stone & Lime Co., Inc., will continue construction of the bridges over existing Route 15. There will be night work with intermittent traffic stoppages of up to 20 minutes.

Single lane conditions for both northbound and southbound are expected to remain in place for most of the construction season. Watch for trucks entering and exiting the construction area. Wide loads over 14 feet are prohibited in both directions.

Watch for changing traffic patterns through the work area.

The contractor will be paving, installing guide rail and other miscellaneous work on existing Route 15 northbound.

## Northumberland County:

The contractor, Trumbull Corporation, will continue working on the Route 147 southbound bridge over Chillisquaque Creek. Weather permitting, concrete will be placed on the bridge deck. There may be brief traffic delays on Hidden Paradise Road and Ridge Road under the bridge.
