CSVT Update for Upcoming Week

Montoursville, PA – Work is progressing on the Northern Section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties as follows:

River Bridge:

The contractor, Trumbull Corporation, will continue work on the CSVT river bridge.

The contractor will finish setting beams on Span 3. The erection of Span 2 is scheduled to begin the week of October 8, 2018. Beams are set in Spans 4 through 8.

Piers 9 through 14 are under construction on the east side of the river. Equipment will be working adjacent to Route 147. Watch for slow moving vehicles in this area.

Work continues of Abutment 2. Backfilling is expected to be complete within the next two weeks.

Winfield Interchange:

The contractor, New Enterprise Stone & Lime Co., Inc., will continue construction of the bridges over existing Route 15.

The contractor will be paving lanes on existing Route 15 in both directions, which will include a traffic pattern switch early next week.

Single lane conditions for both northbound and southbound are expected to remain in place for most of the construction season. Watch for trucks entering and exiting the construction area. Wide loads over 14 feet are prohibited in both directions.

Northumberland County:

The contractor, Trumbull Corporation, will continue working on three bridge locations: Wooded Run Bridge, Chillisquaque Creek Bridges and Ridge Road Bridges.
